Within this context the most important assessment question we can ask ourselves as educators is: Who are our students becoming as thinkers and learners as a result of their time with us? SKILL DEVELOPMENT

SKILL DEVELOPMENT MUST TAKE A FRONT SEAT IN PROGRESSIVE EDUCATION.

What does it mean to be a successful learner or graduate in today's world? While in years past, a solid acquisition of the “three Rs” (reading, writing, and arithmetic) and mastery in the core academic subjects may have been the measure of attainment, the world of the 21st century requires a radically different orientation. To participate effectively in the increasingly complex societies and globalized economy that characterize today's world, students need to think critically, communicate effectively, collaborate with diverse peers, solve complex problems, adopt a global mindset, and engage with information and communications technologies, to name but just a few requirements.

Recognizing that traditional education systems have generally not been preparing learners to face such challenges, the global education community has increasingly talked about and mobilized in favor of the changes required. This has resulted in a suite of initiatives and research around the broad area of “21st century skills.”

“21st century skills are tools that can be universally applied to enhance ways of thinking, learning, working and living in the world. The skills include critical thinking/reasoning, creativity/creative thinking, problem solving, metacognition, collaboration, communication and global citizenship. 21st century skills also include literacies such as reading literacy, writing literacy, numeracy, information literacy, ICT [information and communications technologies] digital literacy, communication and can be described broadly as learning domains.”

CHOOSING THE RIGHT SCHOOL FOR YOUR CHILD!!

Finding a Good Fit

To find the best learning environment, a parent needs to set the following four criteria

- What you want your child to learn (specific subject matter, level of academic difficulty)
- How your child learns best (particular learning style, challenges)
- Social needs (level of contact with peers)
- Practical matters (scheduling, extracurricular activities, etc.)



Pay a Visit

When you find a school that looks like a good fit for your child, it is a good idea to visit to see classrooms and meet faculty and staff. While you are at the school, you should be allowed to visit with the principal, teachers and other parents to get a good idea of what the expectations are for parent involvement, how faculty and staff relate to students and what the overall learning environment looks like.

Ask Questions

Before your school visit, prepare some questions to ask the principal and teachers you meet. Some good questions are listed below :-

- How are teachers trained, supported and monitored?
- How are behavior problems handled at the school?
- How much homework is given to students?

You will probably have a number of your own questions as well, based on the specific learning needs and temperament of your child. Write questions down before you visit to ensure you don't forget to ask any of them.

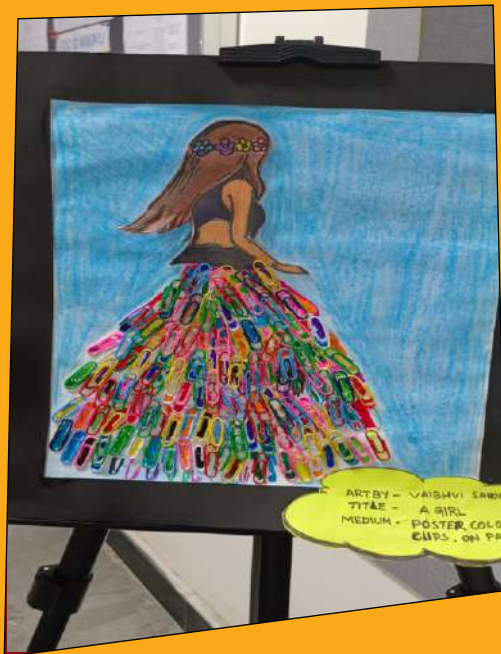

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Student profiles are a means of collecting valuable information about students in our classes. The gathering of information for student profiles can be in a variety of different forms, the most common being Inventories (social, reading, interest) and assessments (report cards, parents, previous teachers). The main types of information gathered in student profiles can be classified into two main categories: social information and learner information. Social information includes any relevant information regarding the social aspects of a student. For instance, interests, family background (who they live with, siblings, etc.), relationships (friends), social ability (easy to make friends, hard, knows social norms and boundaries, etc.). This gives teachers an idea of how a student functions within a social environment, as well as an insight into the students' social scene. Learner information focuses on the ways a student learns best. The goal of a learner profile is to help students understand how best they learn, and for teachers to use this information to help students find a good fit in the classroom.
